I miss the joy of day to day face-to-face interaction, but have been thrilled to see that participation and attendance at virtual meetings and rounds has been high, and that despite the challenges, the work of our department has carried on effectively.


The past year has seen a renewed commitment to support research in the Department of Surgery. The appointment of Dr. Rob Olson as the Associate Head, Research, and the formation of a new Research Committee, will enhance our capacity to encourage and promote research across the spectrum from basic and translational science to clinical trials, and to include faculty at distributed sites across BC. Please read Rob's column in this newsletter for a summary of his vision for research, and preliminary details about a new Seed Grant Program.

We have invested considerable time and effort into strategic planning, with a department-wide survey questionnaire, followed by a series of themed focus groups. Following consultation and discussion with our faculty and staff, we anticipate finalizing the plan of action for

the next few years early in 2022. This will include the usual topics of education, research, and clinical excellence, but will go beyond that to emphasize our commitment to equity, social responsibility, faculty wellness and engagement, and global health. The name change of our Branch for International Surgical Care to the Branch for Global Surgical Care reflects our commitment to surgical care for Indigenous, rural, and remote populations, within our own borders, and also to planetary health, including research and innovation in sustainable health systems to reduce the impact of surgical care on the environment.

As the year concludes, I would like to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of our department members for their contribution to the large enterprise that is the UBC Department of Surgery. I am truly amazed and inspired on a daily basis by your talent, creativity, and commitment to excellence.

Education Updates

Undergraduate Surgical Education

Another year has passed and with it came new challenges and opportunities which have become part of undergraduate surgical education at UBC. As Geoff Blair said, "Who knew that the COVID-19 pandemic would last so long and have such profound effects on everything?"

Given this, I wanted to take the opportunity to express how grateful I am to see ongoing excellence and new transitions occurring at every level in our Undergraduate Surgical Education Program.

Firstly, the pre-clinical years have gotten off to a great start with classes transitioning back to inperson learning and less "Zooming". We hope the comradery of the student body will be re-invigorated by these face-toface sessions. The class of 2023 was able to once again utilize the Surgical Simulation Centre for their introduction to SPC block and Trauma Day, albeit still with some COVID-19 restrictions. Working together with near-peer educators (surgical residents) they were able to work through clinical scenarios utilizing simulation manikins. Of course, the clinical years once again required flexibility from the students with COVID-19 slowing down the OR experience for some. Alternative learning options are being implemented and an exciting new FLEX project to help create surgical teaching videos has been implemented and a few keen

students have already started to work on this. The class of 2022 is wrapping up their last pre-CARMS electives and have really risen to the challenges of COVID-19. I wanted to express how impressed I am with them as they navigate their residency applications and interviews during this time.


Secondly, I wanted to speak to the surgical educators who have continued to provide the best possible learning environment for our students. COVID-19 has added an extra layer of work to everyone's schedule, and the students are thankful for anytime that you take to show them pearls of wisdom; whether it be how to place a horizontal mattress suture, a standard approach to examining an abdomen or, how to clearly communicate with team members, all these moments are valuable learning opportunities. I know that you share the desire to provide our students with a safe and dignified learning environment. This has to be the standard we achieve everyday: students who are fearful do not learn.

I lastly wanted to take the time to thank Geoff Blair for being a wonderful teacher and mentor to so many. As of July 2022, it is with sadness that I have come to accept that he will be moving on to bigger and better things and will no longer serve as the Director of Undergraduate Surgical Education. I have had the privilege of working with him for the past 3 years and I have seen his passion for teaching and improving education first hand. He has been tirelessly working to improve the quality of surgical education at UBC. He does it all: from creating wonderful MCQs and hammering out the famous Surgical Song Book to personally taking the time to help struggling students with how to "think like a

surgeon". Even though he stepped away from practicing as a Pediatric Surgeon a few years back, he continued to do his part by actively providing COVID-19 vaccines alongside nurses and medical students.

As the search for a new Undergraduate Surgical Director unfolds in the New Year, we will continue to improve upon undergraduate surgical education at UBC. Our mandate is to impart to students a framework on how to be a well-rounded medical student, to "think like a surgeon" when appropriate, and to provide them with valuable learning opportunities while simultaneously being "kind, calm, and safe".

Education Updates

PGME Spotlight: General Surgery

Hello from The General Surgery Residency Program! It has been a challenging last 18 months for everyone at UBC. The General Surgery residents and faculty have led and cared for patients and each other through COVID-19 and many natural disasters, as has everybody reading this article. Thank you to everyone for always living the UBC vision "Inspiring people, ideas and actions for a better world".

We have 43 fabulous residents in our program. Our foundational residents have been diligently learning surgery, and adjusting to CBME. We currently have 8 residents pursuing advanced research degrees at UBC, Harvard, Cambridge and Johns Hopkins, with two residents pursuing the Clinical Investigator Program. Our residents are advocating for global and environmental health, and for the broader community raising over \$10,000 last year for the Vancouver Community Food Bank. Our senior residents have been working around the province, a testament to UBC's distributed education mandate.

CaRMS will be virtual again this year. Our residents ran a phenomenal online information campaign and held a highly regarded "How to Ace your Interviews on Zoom" session. The program had a significant focus on equity and diversity in our selection process. Our whole committee did implicit bias testing and we are revamping our scoring rubric to be more inclusive of background experience. We blinded the applications for name and gender. We added a Team Dynamics score to create an objective analysis of abilities

and strengths. All of these steps made our process more fair and transparent, and will hopefully improve our diversity.

We have now completed 10 UBC Academic Symposiums! We were fortunate to be able to do three in person before the pandemic, with seven being held over Zoom. With over 120 faculty members participating from all parts of British Columbia, we were able to highlight the strong clinical and academic calibre of our clinical faculty. 60% of the speakers were from our distributed sites! This novel educational initiative has increased the efficacy of our academic teaching, and will continue in years to come. Our foundational residents are participating in a simulation based Surgical Pentathlon focusing on technical skills. Along with the symposiums, we have engaged in meaningful ways with our distributed sites and provide annual feedback to our distributed sites through a Site Report Card to ensure that education remains of the highest quality. We are about to embark on another round of provincial in-person site visits!

Along with focusing on the Medical Expert role, our program is working on educational innovations in other areas to help with collaboration, curiosity, leadership and communication. For the second year, we held a Surgical Innovation Week for our R2s. With a focus on new design and product ideas, the program has been extremely well received. As of the 2022-23 academic year, our R3s will embark on a brand new Cultural Safety and Professional Communication course. This will also be in conjunction with a new UBC General Surgery Health Equity Grant, focusing on clinical research in health system inequities. Our R4s this year, for the first time, completed a leadership course called RISE. Modeled on leadership programs offered by leading institutions, our course focused on leading self, others, patient safety and quality improvement and approaches to self reflection and coaching in surgery.

It has been a wonderfully productive last few years in the General Surgery Residency Program, and we look forward to collaborating with the broader Department!



Research Updates




I am honoured and excited to take on the new Associate Head Research role within the Department. In my short time in this role, many faculty members have offered to help support our research growth, despite the increased administrative and clinical responsibilities they face during COVID-19. I look forward to working with these individuals and welcome further input into how we can empower faculty to perform high impact research.

As a first step, we have formed a Department of Surgery Research Committee that first met in early December, and contains a broad composition of members from different backgrounds. This committee will help guide the future vision for research, as well as drive increased support for emerging investigators. Stay tuned for information on a planned research retreat where you can learn about the committee's vision, practical research support available, funding opportunities, and to help select 1-3 "big ideas" for the Department's research focus.

I have several personal goals for the Department's research growth, including enhanced research mentorship, increased clinical trial participation and leadership especially in the distributed sites, and increased application and success in large grants including Michael Smith Health Research BC and CIHR. In order to

facilitate this latter goal, the research committee has endorsed a Department of Surgery Seed Grant Program, which will be available to all members, though adjudicated with preference to support investigators where the seed grant will have the largest impact (e.g. early research career).

While I am excited to see future growth of research in the Department, I am already impressed with the high quality that we lead. The 2021 Chung Research Day gave us an excellent opportunity to highlight some of these projects, including:




